

## **IMPORTANT NOTICE FOR DOG HANDLERS**

These days, any biting incident or attempt at biting that TAG has to report to our liability insurance could cause them to <u>drop us</u>.

Any biting/lunging incident involving the public or a fellow volunteer could cost the dog its life.

These are dogs with uncertain backgrounds; therefore it is crucial to remember:

- 1. Always keep the dog close to you
- 2. Always put yourself between the dog and any person or dog.
- 3. It is very helpful when TAG members handle dogs at adoption events. Please <u>do not</u> handle dogs at these events unless you are invited to do so by Shelter Staff or a TAG officer.
- 4. At adoption events, keep away from other dogs being handled and watch your dog's body language at all times especially if you are talking with a potential adopter! Until fully trained these dogs could spook at a noise or a touch and lunge very quickly.

Your efforts are <u>tremendously appreciated</u>, but a dog incident is the biggest threat to our organization.
